1. **(10 points.)** A river R is flowing with respect to ground G with velocity $\vec{v}_{RG} = 2.0\hat{i}\text{ m/s}$. A boat B can move in still water with a speed of $v_{BR} = 6.0\text{ m/s}$. The banks of the river are separated by a distance of 200.0 m. The boat is moving with respect to river with velocity $\vec{v}_{BR} = 6.0\hat{j}\text{ m/s}$. The boat gets drifted. Determine the magnitude and direction of the velocity of the boat with respect to the ground. How far down the river will the boat be drifted?
2. **(10 points.)** A train T travels due South at 30 m/s relative to the ground G in a rain R that is blown toward the South by the wind. The path of each raindrop makes an angle of 70° with the vertical, as measured by an observer stationary on the ground. An observer on the train, however, sees the drops fall perfectly vertically. Determine the speed of the raindrops relative to the ground.
